Administrative History

Constance Bella Davis was born in Birmingham into a Jewish family on 12 June 1917. At the time of her birth, her family was living at 273, Great Colmore St, Edgbaston; her parents are listed on her birth certificate as David Papowich, a journeyman tailor, and Esther Papowich (nee Cohen). According to the executor of her will, the family came to Birmingham from Russia and Poland.

Constance Davis was the youngest of three children. The eldest in the family, Rose (or 'Sis' to Constance Davis), 'the family queen', a 'forceful character with a liking for clothes and a facility with the piano', was born on 22 February 1901; next came Harry, 'the kindest and dearest of brothers', born in 1909; and finally, in 1917, Constance, 'a bubble of fun' and the perennial baby of the family. Constance Davis and her sister changed their names by deed poll in 1948; they had been using the name Davis for some time before this. Constance changed her surname only, becoming Constance Bella Davis instead of Constance Bella Papowich; Rose become Betty Rose Davis instead of Rebecca Rose Papowich.

A family tree in the collection gives some information about Constance Davis's extended family: according to this, her mother's parents Amelia Bandell and Alexander Cohen were married at Singers Hill Synagogue, Birmingham in c. 1878. They had three children: Emmy; Annie, who married Mr Gillman and had two children, Rosie and Dorothy; and the youngest, Esther, Constance Davis's mother, born in 1879, who married David Leib (Lewis) Papowich in c. 1900.

On her father's side, the tree lists David Papowich's parents as Mona and Mattisyahu Papowich.

Neither Constance nor Rose married; their brother Harry married Lilian Cohen on 24 December 1939 and they had one daughter, Leslie.

The earliest information about the family comes from a group of letters written by Constance Davis's mother Esther to her sister Rose during the Second World War, beginning in early 1941 and ending in 1943. Constance and her mother, with Harry and his wife Lilian, have moved out of Birmingham to Hereford, leaving Rose in Birmingham. Esther describes their search for accommodation in Hereford, mentions that Constance is working in munitions, and confides in Rose about her distress at not being able to cook kosher food.

Constance Davis's diaries for the years 1945-46 give an insight into her social life, her work, her interest in fashion, and her family life. Around 1946, she began working for the Post Office, eventually becoming a supervisor.

In 1948, the family was living at 9, Bournbrook Rd, Selly Park; they were still there in 1962. By 1948, Constance Davis's father David had died. In 1951, she visited Paris; this was the first of many trips abroad, and the large collection of holiday photographs in the archive includes trips to India, Thailand, Tenerife, Israel, and Switzerland, often with her close friend Frances Cohen.

Most of the rest of the archive dates from the years following Constance Davis's retirement in 1977. As well as the holiday photographs, it contains a large collection of pictures of family

and friends, some dating from the 19th century. Apart from Frances Cohen, who was like a sister, other close friends included Ben Tossman, some ten years her senior, and her cousin Dorothy Gillman, whose papers are catalogued as MS 2525.

Constance Davis's mother Esther died in 1967 at the age of 88. In 1977, Constance Davis retired from her job at the Post Office, having worked there for over 31 years.

Her brother Harry died on 9 February 1981, following an accident.

By 1990, Constance and Rose were living together at 30 Dollery Drive, Priory Rd, Edgbaston, Birmingham B5, the address given on Rose's death certificate.

Constance Davis's last years were overshadowed by depression, following the loss of her close friends and family: her sister Rose died on 26 March 1993; Frances Cohen at the end of 1992/c. 1993 and Ben Tossman in 1999.

In 2000, she moved from Dollery Drive to sheltered housing at 1, Silverstone Court, River Brook Drive. Her health failed in 2000, and she went into hospital several times before her death in the Selly Oak Hospital on 5 July 2000. She was buried in the Jewish cemetery at Witton.

Family photographs, some 19th-century, holiday photographs, letters, diaries, greetings cards and other personal papers belonging to Constance Davis and her family and friends. The collection includes birth and death certificates and correspondence between her executor and her solicitor following her death in 2000. This is one of several collections deposited by the Birmingham Hebrew Congregation. Most of the material deposited relates to Singers Hill Synagogue (JA), but there is also a small collection of records from the New Synagogue, Park Road (JB), which merged with Singers Hill in 1997. The archive also contains records of the Birmingham Jewish Arts Society (MS 2520), Birmingham Youth Council (MS 2522), Young Israel Council (MS 2523), Birmingham Shechita Board (MS 2529), Birmingham Hebrew Educational Aid Society (MS 2539), and the personal papers of the historian Zoe Josephs (MS 2524). The personal papers of Dorothy Gillman (MS 2525) and Constance Davis (MS 2526) were also deposited by the Congregation.

Other collections held by Birmingham City Archives which may be of interest include Birmingham and District War Refugees Fund (MS 652), which includes minute books, registration forms, and correspondence, and may include information about Jewish refugees; records of Henry Yeoville Thomason (MS 1460), which include architectural drawings of Singers Hill Synagogue; personal papers of CB Lander (1904-1989), including family papers about naturalization, Jewish friends, and Jewish affairs and history (MS 1515); microfilms of minutes of the Birmingham Hebrew Philanthropic Society, the Birmingham Hebrew Educational Aid and Clothing Society, the Ladies Benevolent Board, and the Board of Guardians (MS 1678); and papers of Dr Carl Chinn (MS 1902), which contain some material about the Jewish community in Birmingham, including several autobiographies.

Birmingham Central Library Local Studies and History holds material about the Jewish community including a set of Birmingham Hebrew Congregation Yearbooks, 1913-1971; an Order of Service held to celebrate the opening of the Birmingham Hebrew School at St Luke's
